- WEDNESDAY:** Morning visit to Blists Hill Victorian Town, an open air museum and part of the Ironbridge Gorge. Children will experience what life was like in Victorian Britain, meeting some (almost) real Victorians in their authentic shops and cottages, buy curious goods from a bygone era and watch tradespeople in action in their atmospheric workshops and factories. The cost of the coach and entry is included in the price below. The children will have a packed lunch during their visit.
- COST:** The total cost for this trip will be £497.00. This year we are including the children's pocket money on the invoice for the trip, to make it easier for our busy parents. We suggest a pocket money allowance of £20. Please see payment details overleaf.
