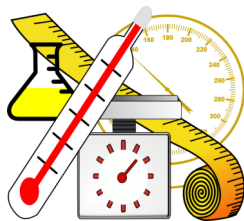


Year 3 Summer Term 1 - 2021

This half term we will continue to master key elements of the Year 3 SPAG programme.

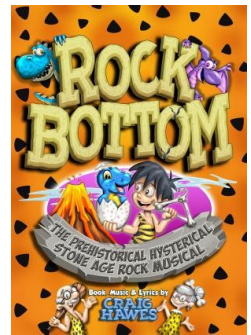
In Creative Writing we will carry out our the following tasks:-

Science

This half term we will be looking at 'Helping Plants Grow Well'

Over the coming weeks we will be able to:-

- * Recognise that plants provide food for humans and other animals
- * Name the different parts of the plant and their function
- * Explain what a plant needs in order to survive.



Homework

Year 3 homework is all about consolidating what we have learned in the classroom and, on occasion, investigating other ideas or facts independently.

This half term homework will follow the same pattern as in the previous term. Year 3 will spend 30 minutes working on a variety of tasks, mainly in Maths and English and 10 minutes reading every night.

A topic homework is occasionally set on a Friday.

Music

Year 3 will rehearse as the 'Rebutia Cast' to prepare a socially-distanced video performance of "Could You Hug a Cactus?" based on the poems of Phillip Van Wagoner, by special arrangement with Beat by Beat Press.

Computing

Year 3's new topic this half term is *Communication and Collaboration*. Their learning will include understanding computer networks (including the internet); how they can provide multiple services, such as the World Wide Web; and the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration, notably email. Children will recap on how to use the internet safely.

French

Pupils will continue their introduction to reading and writing in French and recognising the difference in spelling and pronunciation.

All topics encourage the 4 skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing.

This term's topic is about days of the week and months of the year. The children will be able to recite the days of the week and months of the year and ask and answer the question *Quelle est la date de ton anniversaire?*
